

Best Choices Guide

Spanish (BA)

This Associate of Arts degree is designed for Colorado Community College System (CCCS) students who want to transfer to UCCS and complete a Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Spanish. It is based on the [best academic advising choices](#) for future UCCS students. Please note that final graduation requirements for the bachelor's degree will be based on your year of admission to UCCS. Contact transfer@uccs.edu for more information.

To earn the Associate of Arts degree with Designation (DwD), students must complete courses listed on page 1 of this guide for a total of 60 credit hours. At least 34 credits must be GT Pathways Courses. At least 15 credit hours must be earned from the CCC granting the AA or AS degree. Courses taken at other colleges, AP, IB, CLEP, DSST, and other sources of credit may not be applicable upon transfer to UCCS even if applied to the associate's degree at CCCS. A cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better is required for transfer student admission to UCCS. A minimum grade of C- or higher is required for courses to transfer to UCCS.

¹Reasoning Skills – UCCS

The College of Letters, Arts and Sciences (LAS) at UCCS requires all students to complete a Reasoning Skills requirement. It can be completed in two ways:

1. Take MAT 1240, Math for the Liberal Arts, **OR**
2. Take MAT 1340, College Algebra (or higher) **AND either** MAT 1260, Intro to Statistics **or** PHI 1013, Logic. PHI 1013 fulfills a GT-AH3 course for the AA/AS.

Spanish majors should complete option 1, MAT 1240.

Language other than English – UCCS

Beginning fall 2023, the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences (LAS) at UCCS requires all students to complete a language requirement as part of their degree program. Students majoring in Spanish will automatically complete this requirement. **Contact (transfer@uccs.edu) with questions.**

Spanish Major Notes

Spanish 111/1011, 112/1012, 211/2011, and 212/2012 will be applied to the Bachelor's degree as elective credit toward graduation.

² Those students who have a higher proficiency level than is required for SPA 211/2011 or 212/2012 should substitute other Arts & Humanities courses. Heritage speakers may want to substitute SPA 261/2061 (Grammar-Heritage Lang Speaker) and SPA 262/2062 (Comp-Heritage Lang Speaker), if available.

³ SPA 111/1011 and/or 112/1012 may be waived, based on a student's proficiency level. Students should consult a departmental advisor.

UCCS Bachelor of Arts, Spanish Major Requirements

- A minimum of 120 hours must be completed with a cumulative CU grade point average of 2.0; at least 45 of these hours must be at the upper-division level (courses numbered 3000-4999).
- The Spanish major requires a minimum of 36 hours of Spanish coursework and 6 hours of Foreign and Cultural Studies coursework with a grade point average of 2.0, and at least 27 of the hours must be at the upper-division level.
- Spanish courses numbered below 212 do not count towards the major and may increase the overall hours needed for the degree.
- At least 30 hours of the degree must be completed while registered in the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences at UCCS.
