Spanish (BA)

This Associate of Arts degree is designed for Colorado Community College System (CCCS) students who want to transfer to UCCS and complete a Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Spanish. It is based on the best academic advising choices for future UCCS students.

To earn the Associate of Arts Degree, students must complete the following course requirements for a total of 60 semester credit hours, at least 34 of which must be Colorado State-Guaranteed Courses. Courses taken at other colleges, AP, IB, CLEP, DSST, and other sources of credit may not be applicable upon transfer to UCCS even if applied to the associate's degree at CCCS. Check the CDHE's <u>GT Pathways</u> website for more information.

To transfer to UCCS, students should have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or better.

Spanish Major Notes

Spanish 111, 112, 211, and 212 will be applied to the Bachelor's degree as elective credit toward graduation.

- ¹SPA 111 and/or 112 may be waived, based on a student's proficiency level. Students should consult a departmental advisor.
- ² Those students who have a higher proficiency level than is required for SPA 211 or 212 should substitute other Arts & Humanities courses. Heritage speakers may want to substitute SPA 261 (Grammar-Heritage Lang Speaker) and SPA 262 (Comp-Heritage Lang Speaker), if available.

Other AA/AS Requirements

- A minimum of 60 credit hours in a prescribed program of study with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (a C average). At least 15 of these credit hours must be earned from CCCS.
- Only 6 elective credits are allowed in any combination of PED courses.
- Career and technical courses, whether taken at another institution or at CCCS, are not accepted toward this degree without approval of the CCCS Vice President for Instructional Services. Approval is given only when it is appropriate to the educational objectives of the student.
- Courses numbered below 100 do not apply towards degrees

UCCS Bachelor of Arts, Spanish Major Requirements

- A minimum of 120 hours must be completed with a cumulative CU grade point average of 2.0; at least 45 of these hours must be at the upperdivision level (courses numbered 3000-4999).
- The Spanish major requires a minimum of 36 hours of Spanish coursework and 6 hours of Foreign and Cultural Studies coursework with a grade point average of 2.0, and at least 27 of the hours must be at the upper-division level (courses numbered 3000-4999).
- Spanish courses numbered below 212 do not count towards the major and may increase the overall hours needed for the degree.
- The last 30 hours of the degree must be completed while registered in the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences at UCCS.
- In addition to the requirements listed on this handout, students are required to complete one course in Oral Communication, Cultural Diversity and Global Awareness. The courses may be within the major, part of general education or electives. Spanish majors will have met the Oral Communication and Global Awareness requirements by completing COM 115 plus one course from ANT 101, GEO 105 or GEO 106 at the community college.
