# **English Literature (BA)**

This Associate of Arts degree is designed for PPCC students who want to transfer to UCCS and complete a Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in English Literature. It is based on the <u>best academic advising choices</u> for future UCCS students.

To earn the Associate of Arts Degree, students must complete the following course requirements for a total of 60 semester credit hours, at least 35 of which must be Colorado State-Guaranteed Courses. Courses taken at other colleges, AP, IB, CLEP, and other sources of credit may not be applicable upon transfer to UCCS even if applied to the associate's degree at PPCC.

To transfer to UCCS, students should have a cumulative GPA of 2.4 or better, *including all remedial and repeated courses*. (Students with a transfer GPA between 2.0 and 2.39 will be considered for admission.) Each transfer course must have a grade of "C" or better.

#### **Other AA Requirements**

- 1. A minimum of 60 credit hours in a prescribed program of study with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 (a C average). At least 15 of these credit hours must be earned from PPCC.
- 2. Only 6 elective credits are allowed in any combination of PED courses.
- 3. Career and technical courses, whether taken at another institution or at PPCC, are not accepted toward this degree without approval of the PPCC Vice President for Instructional Services. Approval is given only when it is appropriate to the educational objectives of the student.
- 4. Courses numbered below 100 do not apply towards degrees

#### Foreign Language Note – UCCS

UCCS admission requirements include 2 years of the same high school foreign language (or equivalent 2 semesters at Pikes Peak Community College). Students planning to attend UCCS who do not have the prerequisite foreign language requirement should consider enrolling in these courses in addition to the degree requirements. Students who do not meet this requirement will need to fulfill it upon transferring to UCCS. This admission requirement does not apply to those who graduated from high school prior to 1988, who have a GED, who graduated from a non-U.S. high school, or who can prove proficiency in a foreign language through the 2<sup>nd</sup> semester at college level. **Please check with the Transfer Advisor (ppcc@uccs.edu) to see if this requirement applies to you.**

#### UCCS Bachelor of Arts, English – Literature option Major Requirements

- 1. A minimum of 120 hours must be completed with a cumulative CU grade point average of 2.0; at least 45 of these hours must be at the upper-division level (courses numbered 3000-4999).
- 2. The English major requires a minimum of 45 hours with a grade point average of 2.0; at least 45 hours in the major must have grades of "C-" or better, and at least 18 of the hours must be at the upper-division level (courses numbered 3000-4999)
- 3. The last 30 hours of the degree must be completed while registered in the College of Letters, Arts and Sciences at UCCS.
- 4. In addition to the requirements listed on this handout, students are required to complete one course in Oral Communication, Cultural Diversity and Global Awareness. The courses may be within the major, part of general education or electives. English majors will have met the Oral Communication and Global Awareness requirements by completing COM 115 plus one course from ANT 101, GEO 105 or GEO 106 at the community college. The Cultural Diversity requirement will be met by taking an approved elective course at UCCS.
- 5. The English department also offers options in Professional/Technical Writing and Rhetoric & Writing. This transfer guide facilitates transfer for either of those options as well.

  However, if you would like to pursue one of these options, please see an advisor immediately upon entering UCCS, as your curriculum once at UCCS will vary from the program above.
